FIRST REUNION OF MATTESON FAMILY

The first reunion of the Mattesons and their families was held, Monday, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Zechariah T. Matteson, son of the late Burton Matteson, in the Seamans District, Town of Albion, which was the home of Burton and Lydia Matteson. There were nearly one hundred present, some coming from a long distance to meet the members of the family.

As near as can be ascertained, the Matteson family sprang from Alexander Matteson [this is incorrect], who was one of the early settlers of Vermont in the region of Bennington. Some of his descendants came to New York state and settled in the town of Albion where they cleared the land and built their homes. There were several large families who sprang from the settlers, the largest of which, we believe, was the family of Burton with Charles a close second.

At this reunion, there were two of Burton's sons, James, of Camden and Zechariah, of the old homestead. Of the family of Charles there were four daughters and two sons present. These made the largest representation of any one family. [And nobody from Chas's brother Albert!]

Tables had been arranged for the reunion dinner on the lawn of which ninety-four partook. The host called the gathering to order and grace was said by B.G. Seamans of Pulaski [who just happened to be the owner and editor of the newspaper where this article appeared]. After dinner election of officers resulted in selecting Zechariah Matteson as president and James K. Matteson as vice-president; G.C. Matteson was elected secretary and treasurer. The vote for place of next meeting resulted in selecting the same place where it was held this year, date to be announced by the officers. Mrs. Arthur Ackley [the grandson of the first Arthur] took a picture of the company [which unfortunately I cannot find—NM]. Mrs. Alice West, daughter of Sophia Matteson Ackley was the oldest grandchild of Burton Matteson present. Regrets were read from Mrs. Geo. Williams of Black River.

After a very pleasant hour spent in renewing old acquaintances, all joined in singing some old songs and the reunion came to an end. It was voted that thanks were due Mr. and Mrs. Z.T. Matteson for the work they did in making their home ready for the event and all who helped to plan and carry plans for the reunion.

The second reunion of the Mattisons and their families was held, Monday, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Zachariah T. Mattison, son of the late Burton Matteson, near Altmar, which was the home of Burton and Lydia Matteson, descendants of [Thomas Hezekiah] Matteson, one of the early settlers of Vermont. There were one hundred and fifty-one present; some coming from a long distance to meet the members of the family. Although the weather was not all that could have been desired and several changes in the day's program had to be made, the number who attended and general good time made those who had worked for the day's success feel more than repaid for their efforts.

The host with Mrs. Matteson greeted the friends as they arrived with a handshake and a few pleasant words. Tables were arranged so all could be seated at one time, being decorated with flags and flowers. The President called the gathering to order and dinner was announced, grace being said by Chas. Dyer. There was a good number present when the tables were spread under the shade of the maples, but the shade was not so much needed as it had been cool and cloudy all the forepart of the day, but the dinner was over before rain interfered. After dinner the secretary called the company to order and turned the chairmanship over to B. G. Seamans who presided while election of officers was carried out. Mr. Z. T. Mattison was elected president to succeed himself and C. Fred Mattison, of new Berlin, was elected vice president; G. L. Mattison, of Centerville, was reelected secretary and treasurer.
